#### HOW IS KHANMIGO DIFFERENT FROM OTHER TUTORING WEBSITES


Since Khanmigo is AI based it can converse with the student in natural english language.

#### COLLEGE PREP ESSAY-BRAINSTORMING

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Great! Here are some common pitfalls to avoid:

- Don't tell someone else's story! Even if your essay features someone who inspired you, the focus of the essay must remain on you: specifically, the transformation that the person's influence inspired in you.
- Avoid arrogance or diminishing others. You never want to be boastful, and you never want to reflect negatively on
  yourself or others.
- Volunteer experience can be a great topic for an admission essay, as long as you avoid comparing your life or your circumstances to those of the people you helped. While gratitude is wonderful, an essay on that theme may not be the best way to reveal your unique personality or passions.
- Don't write about a game or match you saw or played in, unless it's an unusual story that reveals something unique about you. College admissions officers read tons of essays about "the big game", so this just won't be memorable to them.
- Don't write about the death or illness of a grandparent, unless it's an unusual story that reveals something unique about you. Again, losing a grandparent is a common experience among young people; you just want to make sure you're saying something unique about who you are, and how the experience changed you or your trajectory in life.
- Don't write about the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Don't list your accomplishments.

Above all, whatever topic you pick should make for an essay that is engaging, unique, and memorable, and that reflects well on you as a person.


